Our approach is grounded in proactively providing for the physical and emotional safety of our students and creating a culture that is centered on building trusting relationships between students and staff.

We are also fully committed to meeting the social and emotional needs of our school communities. In the wake of the tragedy in Nashville, we will encourage staff to use our <u>The</u> <u>Day After guidance</u>, which creates a safe space for students to voice their concerns and speak openly about their feelings.

Please know that school safety remains our absolute top priority, and that we will do everything we can to help our District heal in response to this tragedy. We appreciate your support and thank you for your continued partnership as we work to meet the needs of all students during this challenging time.
